

Dancing & The Walled City **CTGL25** **Approx. Duration: 4 ½ hours** **Level 2, Snack**
 Dance demonstration and try some moves yourself! Continue to the beautiful walled colonial city for a walking tour and more. Your Cartagena experience begins at a salon located inside the Old Town, just a short drive from the pier. Upon arrival you get a short introduction to Colombian dance styles and a professional dance demonstration while you enjoy a traditional meal. You'll have the opportunity to try some of the moves that you've seen. Next, you'll continue on to the walled colonial city for a walk. You'll be provided a brief overview and a map and your guide will lead you through the Main Plaza, Customs Plaza and more. You'll then have an hour and a half of free time to explore this incredible city with its many cafes, art, bars and shops. At a museum, enjoy a cup of Colombian coffee or stroll along the beautiful streets as you admire the flower filled balconies and architecture. At the previously designated time and place, you'll rejoin your group for the transportation back to your ship. Approximately one hour of walking or standing. Participants should be able to stand and walk unassisted and easily navigate narrow pathways. This tour is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties or in a wheelchair.

Chiva **CTGL14** **Approx. Duration: 3 hours** **Level 2**
 Chiva! Drink, laugh, clap, sing and listen to jokes, as you enjoy non-stop "papayera" or "vallenato". Meet new people and take part in the open bar while your Chiva takes you around Cartagena. You'll make a photo stop at San Felipe Fortress, Bocagrande, El Centro, Boca Grande, Laguito, Castillo Grande, and the old city. Your Chiva will stop at the historic Santa Catalina's market to stretch, enjoy refreshments, dance to the beat of the music band or enjoy local entertainment. You'll have some time for shopping at Las Bovedas Artisan Center.

These are old artisan modified buses used in rural areas for public transport. They are painted colorfully with local arabesques and the chivas have an incorporated ladder for the rack on the roof which is also used for carrying people; seats are benches and with doors instead of windows and all of them have a unique nickname. Wear comfortable shoes and casual clothing and sunscreen.

Canoe Journey **CTGL06** **Approx. Duration: 3 hours** **Level 1**
 A scenic drive for a view of the San Felipe de Barajas Fortress, situated outside the walled city. This fort is considered to be the greatest feat of Spanish military engineering in the new world. After a quick drive through the narrow streets of the walled city, you'll reach the coastline to La Boquilla fishing village. You'll visit the Cueva del Manglar, a protected eco-system that's teeming with a variety of life. A leisurely canoe ride through the mangrove tunnels. As you glide through the swamp waters, keep your eyes open for a variety of life such as kingfisher, white heron, common Laura, pink spatula and pelicans. Relax as you enjoy the beautiful flora and fauna of this fascinating eco-system. Enjoy a panoramic tour of the old city of Cartagena on the drive back to your ship. Wear comfortable clothing and shoes, bring sunscreen and a hat. Guests do not paddle the canoes.

Old Town Bay & Walled City **CTGL26** **Approx. Duration: 4 hours** **Level 2**
 Enjoy a day on an enlightening walking tour of the walled section of Cartagena, a large vibrant area full of colonial architecture and history. After departing from the pier in a sleek catamaran, you will enjoy a meandering cruise across the bay, taking in the views. While much of Cartagena is dotted with modern residential towers, it is still the Old Town that captures the imagination. You will disembark for a walking tour of Cartagena's walled district, which is so architecturally significant that it has been named a World Heritage site. The designation recognizes the city's extensive military fortifications and the importance of the Old Town of San Diego, San Pedro and Gethsemani. Construction of the walls began in the late 16th century to protect the city from pirate attacks after Sir Francis Drake wantonly burned and ransacked the city in 1585. As you walk the atmospheric walled section, you will see a vast array of wonderful colonial architecture, churches, mansions and squares like Plaza de San Pedro. You might even walk along the top of the wall for a magnificent sweeping view of the Caribbean. Or you may spend the day in Old Town shopping for designer fashions, local artwork and emerald jewelry. Colombia is the world's largest producer of emeralds. You can expect a wide selection of merchandise.

At the end of the time, you'll rejoin your guide and embark your catamaran for the scenic return cruise to the pier. This cruise includes approximately 2 hours of easy to moderate walking, plus any additional walking at the guests' discretion during free time. Guests with walking difficulties, who are unable to make their own way on and off the catamaran, and have an able-bodied companion to assist them. Enjoy the views and enjoy the amazing views and the azure waters of Cartagena's bay. Your highlights worthy to be explored: The Clock Tower, The Palace of the Inquisition, San Pedro Claver Church. This option gives you high time to explore on your own. Make sure you are back in time to board your catamaran back to Cartagena's Cruise ship.

Approximately 15 minutes each way. The catamaran runs to a strict timetable and if you miss one of the departures you will have to wait for the next one to depart.

Cartagena, Colombia

Exploring Magnificent Cartagena

CTGL01

Approx. Duration: 4 ½ hours

Explore and discover the magnificent city of Cartagena. Begin with a stop at the Navy Museum which includes a folk show and a small chapel to see the famous wooden statue of the Virgin, and marvel at the wonderful gold leaf laminated main altar. Felipe de Barajas situated outside the walled city for a panoramic view of this monumental fort considered to be the most important Spanish military engineering in the New World. Continue to Las Bovedas Artisan Center, built as dungeons and as a means of defense through narrow cobblestone streets and squares inside the walled city. Wander through Plaza de Bolivar which features the namesake. Visit the Inquisition Palace, established in the year 1610 to punish any crimes against the Catholic faith. You'll see the torture chambers. Next, visit the San Pedro Claver cloister. Before returning to your ship, take home some souvenirs from the Gallo shopping center and enjoy panoramic sightseeing through Bocagrande, the modern part of the city.

Note: Casual clothes and comfortable shoes are recommended. Wear sunscreen and bring your camera.

Highlights of Cartagena & Folkloric Show

CTGL02

Approx. Duration: 4 hours

Start your tour of the beautiful city of Cartagena with a photo stop at San Felipe de Barajas Fortress, situated outside the walled city. Considered the largest Spanish fort in the New World. Continue to the Old City and wander through narrow cobblestone streets while you admire the Colonial architecture, balconies and old churches. Your next stop will be the Gold Museum where you'll see displays of valuable pre-Columbian gold artifacts and some of the old ceramics in the Americas. You'll also learn about the amazing hydraulic engineering achievements. Enjoy a folkloric show during your visit to the Navy Museum which was established in 1982. Here, you'll find historic military efforts of Cartagena, see the wealth of historical artifacts, maritime life and naval history of the city. A soft drink or water of water or soft drink will be served upon arrival at the museum. Before returning to your ship, enjoy panoramic sightseeing through Bocagrande, the modern part of the city.

Note: Casual clothes and comfortable shoes are recommended. Wear sunscreen and bring your camera.

Discover Colombia

CTGL15

Approx. Duration: 4 ½ hours

Your day of discovery begins when you board your air conditioned transportation. You'll pass by buildings and homes in the Republican and Moorish styles and your guide explains the many influences that came to be in Cartagena. Your first stop is at the 'La Icacos', near the fishing village of La Boquilla. Here, you'll be greeted by local fishermen who earn a living by traditional fishing. These fishermen will explain the process of making, repairing and casting the nets, as well as provide a demonstration. You'll have the opportunity to learn the art of throwing the net if you wish or you can also sip on fresh coconut milk or coconut water with your companions cast the net. On your way back to Cartagena your guide will provide you with more information regarding the walled city including the "Vallenato". The Vallenato is a traditional type of music typically using an accordion, flute and drum. Next, stop at Bocagrande where you'll be greeted and entertained by your own band of Vallenato. Sample a traditional Colombian snack or "frito" while making your way to the Emerald Museum. Here, you'll see craftsmen at work as well as learn the history and cultural significance of the precious stone. Then, visit the famous walled or Old City and Portal de Dulce, an area where local vendors sell the handcrafted candies, famous around the world. Take a sweet sample before continuing your walk through the Plaza de la Aduana and Plaza de Armas Square. Along the way your guide will point out areas of interest as well as information on the many churches, buildings and architecture and flower covered balconies before returning to your ship.

Note: Bring comfortable shoes and casual clothes. Wear sunscreen. Participants must be able to stand and walk unassisted and easily navigate narrow pathways. The roads to the village can be bumpy.

San Felipe Fortress **CTGL20** **Approx. Duration: 4½ hours** **Level 3**
 Cartagena with its colonial architecture and impressive fortifications. Pass by the famous Republican architecture of Manga to some of the most ornate mansions and homes of the city. Visit the Fort of San Felipe de Barajas built in the 17th largest and most important work of Spanish military engineering in South America. You'll stop briefly at Las Bovedas Artisan built as dungeons and for storage - today local artisans display their work here. You'll have some free time to wander the streets and squares inside the walled city. Stop at Plaza de Bolivar which features a statue of its namesake. Across the Inquisition Palace, the Inquisition was established in Cartagena in the year 1610 to punish any crimes against the Catholic faith. You'll see samples of jails and torture chambers. The sentencing ceremony used to take place in public, in the middle of the second floor of the Inquisition Palace there is a small historical museum which includes a few models showing the urban layout as the centuries passed and the city grew. Continue to the Gold Museum where you'll see beautiful displays of valuable gold artifacts and some of the old ceramics in the Americas. Learn about the Zenu's nation's amazing hydraulic engineering through a panoramic view of the Cathedral while you walk to the majestic San Pedro Claver's Sanctuary built to honor the patron saint of slaves. Sit back and take in the views of the modern city during the return drive to your ship. This tour involves walking or standing for extended periods of time on some uneven ground and inclines. Tour is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties.

San Felipe de Barajas **CTGL04** **Approx. Duration: 3½ hours** **Level 2**
 With a panoramic view of the military fort of San Felipe de Barajas. Situated outside the walled city, this monumental fort is the most outstanding feat of Spanish military engineering in the New World. Continue to the El Cabrero neighborhood for the Nunez House and Museum. Rafael Nunez was president of Colombia four times and created the constitution of 1886. The Nunez House and died is built in the spectacular Antilles architectural style. Next, visit the dungeons within the walled city ramparts, to store provisions for the troops and are now home to a high quality handicrafts market selling brightly decorated cloth, even bags made by some of the indigenous peoples of Colombia. Your tour continues to the Palace of Inquisition. The aim of the palace was to judge crimes against the Catholic faith, but it never recognized anyone's innocence. This building whose construction began in 1767 is an example of civilian architecture of the 18th century. Walk to the Plaza Bolivar where you'll visit the Gold Museum complete and beautiful archeological display of the pre-Colombian cultures and the fabled El Dorado. You'll have some spare time in the old city for the famous Colombian emeralds or an opportunity to take more pictures of this lovely city. The Gold Museum is closed on Mondays and will be substituted by a visit to Galeria, which has replicas of the Gold Museum. There are also shops at Las Bovedas Artisan Center and at the Emerald Shop.

Old City & City at Leisure **CTGL22** **Approx. Duration: 4 hours** **Level 2**
 San Felipe de Barajas built in the 17th century and discover the charm of colonial Cartagena. Explore on your own. Admire the Republican architecture of La Manga residential area, home to some of the most ornate and beautifully sculpted homes of the city. Continue on with your journey for a 40 minute visit to San Felipe de Barajas. Make you to the walled city where you will enjoy a guided walking tour as well as some time on your own. Marvel at the colonial buildings and fortifications around every corner, as well as the old church domes, the clock tower and the dazzling views from Marina Park, you'll be dropped off to explore the beauty of the Old City on your own. Walk the narrow streets and old buildings, enjoy the selection of handicrafts, leather goods or emeralds. During your return drive to the ship, enjoy the sights of the modern city of Bocagrande and Castillo Grande. Walking is at participant's discretion. Walking is on uneven ground, cobblestone streets and some inclines. You'll have a total of 40 minutes in the walled city. This tour is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties or in a wheelchair.

Horse Carriage Ride **CTGL09** **Approx. Duration: 3 hours** **Level 1**
 With a drive to the Fort of San Felipe de Barajas, a 17th-century construction and one of the most important works of Spanish architecture in Latin America, for a photo stop. Admire the majesty of this historic city, where age-old squares are surrounded by Republican and Spanish-style buildings. You'll transfer to your waiting horse and carriage and be transported back in time to the days of the conquistadors on a ride around Cartagena's beautiful old town. You'll ride along the inviting, narrow cobblestone streets and squares inside the walled city, admiring the flower-filled balconies spilling from colonial mansions. Visit Las Bovedas, the former city where have also been used as military barracks, a munitions depot and a jail, but today local artisans display their work there. You'll have time for shopping before enjoying a panoramic drive through the modern side of the city on your way back to your ship. You must be able to negotiate two large steps to get on in and out of the horse carriage. This tour is not suitable for guests with walking difficulties per carriage.

Cartagena through the Photo Lens **CTGL24** **Approx. Duration: 4 ¼ hours** **Level 2**
 Discover the rich history of Cartagena while you capture its magic through your lens. This is a city of contrasts, rich history and culture, with its colonial architecture and fortifications. Enjoy stunning locations and subjects for your photos that will serve as a reminder of your visit. You'll be escorted by a professional photographer and a guide. Take a ride to Marlinda, a small fisherman's village and a living museum of the afro culture that populated Cartagena de Indias. Take a sneak peek at the process of canoe making, enjoy the views of the people and their culture rich with joyful music and dance. Continue to Old Cartagena and immerse yourself in a world of history. The oldest of 480 years of history. Beautiful wood balconies full of flowers, colonial houses with their facades still true to their original construction. Visit the majestic San Pedro Claver Church and discover the history of this Jesuit missionary and patron saint of Cartagena. On your way to your ship, admire the contrast between the historical and the modern areas of this city. This tour is on uneven ground, cobblestone streets and sandy beach. This tour is not recommended for guests with walking difficulties or

Scenic Cartagena **CTGL17** **Approx. Duration: 2 ½ hours**
 Take a panoramic tour of Cartagena. Begin with a photo stop of San Felipe de Barajas Fortress, originally built in the 17th century and considered the largest Spanish fort in the New World. Snap pictures of the ancient towering walls and main entrance. The City where your guide will point out historical facts about the Inquisition Palace, the Cathedral and its dome churches. You'll visit Las Bovedas, built in the late 18th century as dungeons and as a means of storage. Continue your journey for a sightseeing tour of the modern residential area of Bocagrande, famous for its wide variety of hotels and restaurants. Here, you'll have the option to visit Pierino Gallo Mall, or return back to the ship on your own. **Note:** This is a panoramic tour with optional photo stops. Only collapsible/foldable wheelchairs are welcomed. Transportation is by van and cannot accommodate scooters. Participants must be able to negotiate two to three steps up into the transportation. Board Shore Excursion Desk for more details. You have the option to return to the ship either with the tour or on your own.

Exclusive Hop-On Hop-Off Bus **CTGL21** **Approx. Duration: 4 hours**
 This is a Hop-On Hop-Off excursion of a legendary city with more than 450 years of history - Cartagena de Indias. The tour reveals historic secrets that the city walls, buildings and narrow cobble streets guard. You have the flexibility to plan your time for shopping, sightseeing or just exploring this city at your own pace by hopping- on and off where you wish to. Enjoy the panoramic view of the Clock Tower that serves as main entrance to the city, the San Felipe Castle, a fortress built in 1536 and other iconic places of history, from your open top double or single decker bus. Stops include La Bodeguita Pier, San Sebastian de Pastelillo, Castillo de San Sebastian, Bahia Castillo Grande and the Naval Base among others. Also, experience the city on an included walking tour. See the Fort of San Pedro Claver, Las Bovedas dungeons, Santo Domingo Square and other iconic places enriched with history. **Note:** Walking is at guest's discretion. It is recommended that you wear comfortable shoes and bring a hat, sunglasses and a water bottle. The buses can accommodate one manual, collapsible wheelchair and availability must be confirmed before booking the tour. Sidewalks inside the Walled City are narrow, so guests in wheelchairs should have someone to assist them. Entrance fees are included in the tour price. Buses runs approx. every 25-30 minutes. You may not have time to cover all stops so please prioritize your stops.

Exclusive Cartagena **CTGL19** **Approx. Duration: 4 hours**
 Depart the pier to La Popa Monastery, located on top of a hill overlooking Cartagena. This monastery was built at the beginning of the 17th century and houses a Colonial museum and a chapel dedicated to Virgen de la Candelaria, patron saint of Cartagena. Make a stop at San Felipe Fortress. This castle defended the city from many attacks and withstood the bloodiest assault from the British in 1763. Proceed to the Old City where you'll walk approximately five blocks through the Colonial section. Once at Bolivar, visit the Saint Peter Claver Church, the cathedral and the Inquisition Palace. After your walk, drive through the modern part of the city to the Plaza for refreshments and some shopping. Then you'll visit Pastelillo Fort, constructed in the mid 1700's. This is home to some of the exclusive restaurants in town, Club de Pesca. Located in a corner of the 300 year old fortress, the restaurant overlooks the city and has a view of the walled city. At this elegant setting, take in the surroundings while enjoying a delicious Caribbean meal with a contemporary touch. **Note:** Wear comfortable clothing and shoes.

Accessible Cartagena Sightseeing **CTGL23** **Approx. Duration: 2 ½ hours**
 Enjoy this scenic tour of Cartagena with a photo stop at the Fort of San Felipe de Barajas, a visit to the Navy Museum and a performance. Drive through residential area of La Manga, home to some of the most ornate mansions and beautiful views. Continue on with your journey to a photo stop at the Fort of San Felipe de Barajas, originally built in the 17th century and considered a symbol of the city. Continue your journey to the Navy Museum established in 1986, restored ruins of the Jesuits school, discover the history of Cartagena, peruse through the wealth of historical artifacts, maritime life and naval history of Colombia. Also, enjoy a free bottle of refreshing water. After cooling down, board your bus again to see the sights of the modern residential area of Bocagrande in contrast to the old city is modern with high rise apartment complexes, hotels and restaurants. You'll enjoy beautiful views of the city returning to your ship.

Old Cartagena Walking Tour **CTGL18** **Approx. Duration: 3 hours**
 Explore the city of Cartagena, once considered the gem of the Spanish Main and today still surprises visitors with its colonial architecture and impressive fortifications. Pass through the famous "Republican" architecture of Manga residential area, home to some of the most ornate mansions and homes of the city. Continue your journey to one of the most important works of Spanish Military engineering in the New World, Fort of San Felipe de Barajas for a photo stop. Wander the narrow cobblestone streets and squares inside the walled city. Visit Domingo's Bastion, you'll pass by charming colonial architecture to the oldest church in the city - Church of Santo Domingo de Guzman to Plaza de Bolivar, a picturesque tree lined square adorned with statues saluting the city's illustrious past and featuring the namesake. Across the street, see the Inquisition Palace. Then, make your way to the Gold Museum where you'll find beautiful pre-Colombian gold artifacts and some of the old ceramics in the Americas. Learn about the Zenu's nation's hydraulic achievements. Continue to the colonial commercial district of Custom Plaza and down the street to the Cathedral and the headquarters of the Spanish government. Stroll to Plaza San Pedro to see the shrine and church honoring Saint Peter Claver, patron saint of slaves. Soak up the local flavor as you continue your guided walk amidst towering colonial, republican and Spanish architecture to Plaza de Bolivar to the majesty of this historic city. Do some shopping at Las Bovedas Artisan Center, built as dungeons, today local artisans display their work here. On the way back to your ship, enjoy a sightseeing tour through the modern part of Cartagena. **Note:** This tour includes extended periods of walking or standing, it's not recommended for guests with walking difficulties or uneven ground and cobblestone streets. Some venues have a second floor (Inquisition Palace, Gold Museum).

Beach Break **PASL45** **Approx. Duration: 8½ hours** **Level 2, Meal**
 Guests from the Puerto Caldera pier enjoy a 90 minute boat ride through the beautiful and small charming islands that adorn the Gulf of Nicoya, there is a heavenly archipelago of several islands with lush natural beauty and a sanctuary that is white sandy beaches and the flora and fauna of our Central Pacific region. Tortuga Island is located in this beautiful cove, 12 nautical miles from Puntarenas, Tortuga Island (called by local indigenous people "Tolinga") has an area of 120 hectares maintained as a protected forest which has been awarded the Ecological Blue Flag for more than five years. This distinction makes it one of our country that have pollution-free waters. Due to its geographical features, Tortuga Island's waters are clear and optimal for swimming. A delicious lunch will be waiting for you. Explore the island and enjoy the beach, relax or play water sports. Optional activities such as snorkeling and banana boat rides are available at an extra cost. Wear your bathing suit, flip-flops, clothing, tennis shoes or good walking shoes, hat, sunscreen, insect repellent, suntan lotion. Wear your bathing suit and bring a towel.

Wildlife Pura Vida **PASL21** **Approx. Duration: 4¼ hours** **Level 2**
 Guests will go to the tropical forest area of Bijagual, which is located near the boundaries of the Carara Biological Reserve. Here, you'll have the opportunity to visit Pura Vida Botanical Gardens, one of the most spectacular private gardens in Costa Rica. See beautifully landscaped gardens noticing that they are also bordered by one of the tallest waterfalls in the country. Pura Vida is home to over 60,000 plants including 60 varieties of heliconia, 10 varieties of ginger, and orchids. Look for butterflies, macaws, parrots, parakeets, toucans, birds of prey, and waterfowl. During the 1 1/2 hour guided walk along gravel trails, your guide will help you explore this beautiful land. Take in the ocean views in the distance as you meander through the walkways and see some wildlife. After your walk, continue on for a few minutes to Villa Lapas Ecological Hotel, where fresh tropical fruits will replenish your energy. Then stop for souvenirs before heading back to your ship. Weather permitting, a quick stop will also be made at the Tarcoles River for observation.

Participants must be in good health. Those with severe walking or mobility issues should not participate, as there is required walking on some inclines. Wear comfortable clothes and shoes. Bring a hat and camera.

Coffee Experience **PASL24** **Approx. Duration: 6 ½ hours** **Level 1, Meal**
 This excursion allows for an intimate glimpse inside one of the most important aspects that defines Costa Rica as the strongest nation in Central America. Coffee cultivation has been the primary source of income for many Costa Rican families since the turn of the 19th century. Visit a 670-acre cooperative farm owned by more than 2,300 farmers of whom 60% are women. Each member contributes a portion of land to the coop. The coffee that they cultivate and produce is sold directly to one of the largest coffee companies in the world. This coffee is also purchased by Rainforest Alliance, an organization that focuses on the conservation of biodiversity and sustainable development. You'll experience firsthand the coffee roasting process and have the chance to sample the flavorful brew. Also see coffee beans, also known as cherries, are picked, sorted, peeled, fermented and sun-dried. Learn many interesting facts that demonstrate the appreciation of this highly consumed beverage. Feel free to browse the selection of hand-made souvenirs before heading back to the ship. A photo-stop will be made at the largest oxcart monument ever built and a stop at the factory that made it; see the machinery that propels most of the machinery they use to cut and saw the wood. Participants must be at least 18 years of age. There is a considerable amount of walking over even surface and some steps. For wheelchair restricted customers, advance notice is required. Motorized scooters cannot be handled, only foldable wheelchairs. Wear comfortable shoes, sunscreen, a hat and bring a camera and a light bag.

Wildlife & Shopping **PASL37** **Approx. Duration: 4 ¼ hours** **Level 2, Age, Snack**
 Trails and suspended cable bridges will show you the wonders of the tropical forest. Located around national parks and reserves, more than 80 species of birds have been identified as well as mammals such as the Kinkajou, Agoutis, Coatis and more. A downhill walk will offer you breathtaking views of the ocean and coastline, as well as its vegetation and waterways. Participants must be at least 18 years of age. There is a considerable amount of walking on this tour. Not recommended for guests with respiratory conditions due to the heat, humidity and the level of activity. There are uneven dirt trails and you'll cross three rivers. Wear light clothing, insect repellent and sunscreen. Walking or hiking shoes recommended, as well as raingear. Wildlife sightings are common but not guaranteed.

Wildlife & Tarcoles Eco-Cruise **PASL40** **Approx. Duration: 4 ¼ hours** **Level 3, Age, Snack**
 Wonders of the tropical forest, walk along suspended cable bridges and enjoy a motorboat ride on the Tarcoles River to see more diverse views of the protected areas of Costa Rica. The Sky Walk trails and suspended cable bridges are likely to show you the wonders of the tropical forest. Located around national parks and protected lands, more than 120 species of birds have been identified as well as mammals such as the Kinkajou, Agoutis, Coatis, and others. Your downhill walk will enable you to enjoy views of the ocean and coastline, as well as its vegetation and waterways. Drive to your next destination where the Tarcoles River. Take a motorboat ride along the Tarcoles River, famous for its pristine mangrove forest and is a nesting site for the rare scarlet macaw. It also shelters a large variety of resident and migrant aquatic wildlife, iguanas and Jesus Christ lizards, home of the largest mangrove forest in the country. Your river exploration is done using high above the water covered motorized boats. Make sure you keep your camera ready. Listen to marimba music while you enjoy a tropical fruit buffet with fresh fruit juice, water and coffee before returning to your ship. Participants must be at least 8 years of age and in good physical condition. This tour involves approximately (1 kilometer) of walking on dirt or gravel trails including about 120 steps, standing for periods of time and crossing hanging bridges. Guests who are claustrophobic and might experience vertigo crossing hanging bridges should not take the tour. This tour is not recommended for persons with respiratory conditions or with walking difficulties due to the heat, humidity and the level of activity. Wear light clothing, walking gear, insect repellent and sunscreen.

Afterwards, board your Motorcoach in route to the Tarcoles River on a boat and explore the spectacular natural scenery this river has to offer. The river and mangroves attract many types of birds such as toucans, spoonbills, herons, egrets, jacanas, pelicans, scarlet macaws, iguanas and crocodiles. Upon your return, enjoy marimba melodies and enjoy a delicious buffet of seasonal fruits and tropical refreshments. Enough time will be provided to make purchases made by local artisans before returning to your ship.

Note: This excursion might operate in reverse order. Please wear casual clothing, comfortable walking shoes, a hat, sunscreen, camera and raingear. Wildlife sightings while common cannot be guaranteed. Advance notice is needed for guests with motorized scooters cannot be handled, only foldable wheelchairs. The type of walking required is along even roads and trails. A free bird guide will be provided at the beginning of the river cruise, which will allow participants to identify any species seen along the way.

This beautiful coffee plantation was declared a historical and architectural heritage site by the Costa Rican Government. Your guide will relay the story from seed to cup. Enjoy a typical buffet at La Cajuela restaurant surrounded by beautiful gardens with mountain views. You'll then visit souvenir shops and take home some special coffee products. Your last stop will be La Garita, a magnificent coffee plantation featuring a learning greenhouse, flower showroom and a bird area of scarlet macaws, blue and gold macaws and cockatoos.

Note: Wear comfortable shoes, long pants and a light jacket; bring sunscreen and sunglasses.

Scenic Costa Rica

PASL20

Approx. Duration: 3 ¼ hours

Your sightseeing drive through rolling hills, high mountains, plains, valleys, and riverbeds is just part of the gorgeous landscape that makes you think of paradise. Costa Rica's topography is one of the world's most diverse. You'll start by heading east to Escazú, which has become one of the most picturesque in Costa Rica's Central Pacific region. The central park and its church are emblematic of Costa Rica's hardworking rural towns. Local dancers in colorful dresses will greet you at the park and you'll enjoy masquerade and souvenir exhibitions while you learn about their traditions. Your scenic drive includes some stretches along the Pacific Ocean, mango and cashew plantations, farming areas and most certainly seeing some birds along the way, all examples of sustainable development. The opportunity to capture unique pictures, while traveling down to sea level, admiring the most breathtaking views.

Note: Wear comfortable shoes; bring sunscreen, a hat and light clothing.

Artisanal Craft Beer Tasting & Lunch

PASL43

Approx. Duration: 6 hours

Emerse yourself and see first-hand how Costa Ricans have integrated their "Pura Vida" lifestyle into what has been considered the 100 best breweries in the world. See the process and learn how quality beer is developed. Above all enjoy a beer tasting and a fine brews and complete your tour with a hearty lunch with food cooked and stewed in the beer itself. There is a short walk before you are returned to the ship.

Note: Bring a camera and wear comfortable walking shoes.

Sanctuary **PASL39** **Approx. Duration: 4 ¼ hours** **Level 1, Snack**
Sanctuary at El Manantial is a Costa Rican wildlife conservation charity working to save and protect endangered species from poached and quartered in Aranjuez de Puntarenas. Natuwa works with some of the most endangered native birds of Costa Rica, focusing on scarlet macaws and the most fragile habitats. The main focus of the project is the Scarlet Macaw (Ara Macao) and the Great Green Macaw (Ara Gygis), who once flew freely in many areas of Costa Rica. At the Sanctuary, Great Green macaws and Scarlet macaws are bred and traded. They are strictly bred in order to release their young into the wild to be set free forever. In the sanctuary the birds are enjoying the trees and the fruits they can find around this habitat. The local people from the village of Aranjuez care for and raise the macaws. In November 2014 three jaguar cubs were brought to the NATUWA Sanctuary, just a few days old. The Costa Rican rescuers rescued them and brought them to NATUWA to be taken care of because they were orphaned. The three jaguar cubs and Dinamú were able to survive thanks to the care they received at NATUWA. They did not have the opportunity to learn from their mother such as how to hunt and how to mark territory. They have been raised surrounded by humans and this makes them vulnerable and unable to survive in the wild. They have no other option and must stay in captivity. These felines will be part of an environmental education program that involves schools and the general public. The main objective is to generate interest so that visitors understand the vital role that animals play in the forest ecosystem.

Horseriding Show & Countryside **PASL44** **Approx. Duration: 5 ½ hours** **Level 1, Snack**
This is a conditioned bus ride passing a variety of landscapes including mango and watermelon farmlands, lush forests and mountains. We will take you to the highlands of Alajuela Province where the hacienda is located. Rancho San Miguel is a school of highland horses that they have been exhibiting horse fiestas for over 30 years and is famous throughout the Americas for their pure breed of Percheron horses. Upon arrival to the ranch you will be greeted by a local expert who will introduce you to the equine world of mares and stallions. The show combines training of the magnificent Andalusian horses with the mastering ability of the riders, a group of talented young riders who require many months of hard team-work, training and discipline. You will see the mares and their offspring, the hacienda, the long pole and the "equestrian fantasy", a synchronized choreography of the mares. Every act will be presented and explained by an expert while you also enjoy the sounds of the Spanish flamenco music in a spectacular amphitheater. Your last stop will be the outdoor market in Orotina where you will have plenty opportunity to browse around the shop, sample their delicious fruits or buy a cup of coffee. Please wear comfortable clothing, comfortable shoes, hat or visor, sunscreen, insect repellent. Collapsible wheelchairs can be stored underneath the bus in the luggage compartment. The tour sequence may vary.

Wildlife Adventure **PASL46** **Approx. Duration: 7 ½ hours** **Level 2, Meal**
This is a trolley safari into the tropical savanna, where you will see a variety of indigenous and exotic animals before relaxing at a picnic table overlooking the surrounding jungle. After departing from the pier, you will settle in for an immensely scenic drive into the lush Guanacaste National Park, a regional capital of Liberia, known as the "White City" for its white-washed colonial architecture, you will enter Ponderosa National Park. The sprawling wildlife park is home to hundreds of animals, all protected and many of them indigenous to Africa. It's the most beautiful and adventurous safari into the surrounding grassy savanna. To maximize your experience, you will ride in a vehicle open on all sides for panoramic viewing and be given carrots to feed some of the animals. You can expect to encounter giraffes, zebras, emus, ostriches, and camels. You can just imagine the thrill when a giraffe walks over, reaches down and gently plucks a carrot from your hand. You will see all sorts of other animals from a comfortable distance that allows you to view them completely undisturbed. Please be patient and wait for you as you board a 4-wheel-drive, military-style vehicle and ride into the jungle-like countryside. Here, you will find a swimming pool where you can enjoy a refreshing swim. Afterwards, you will enjoy a hearty, buffet-style lunch before returning to the pier. The tour lasts 7 hours to Sabana Park.

Canopy Tour Adventure **PASL19** **Approx. Duration: 3 ½ hours** **Level 3, Age, Weight**
This is a motorized air-conditioned transportation and pass through Puntarenas and its surrounding mangroves. Then, proceed southward past the port of Caldera and small fishing villages, such as Mata de Limon. Next, head inland into the coastal range of mountains. The way, you may encounter different species of birds as well as sugar cane, bananas, coffee, mangos and other crops that are native to North America and Europe. Continue traveling south until you reach the Tarcoles River, where sightings of very large crocodiles are frequent. This is where your Canopy Tour adventure will begin. Upon arrival, you'll be geared up with the necessary equipment and briefed on safety instructions. You'll be guided on a 15 to 20 minute walk through the tropical transition forest to the river. Once here, you'll proceed to the first horizontal traverse cable. The original Canopy tour consists of nine observation platforms. Eight horizontal traverse cables connected between the immense trees of this tropical paradise. Your journey through the forest will take approximately one hour. Here, you may see deer, monkeys and a variety of birds including the endangered scarlet macaw, toucans, and mahogany trees. At the end of the tour you'll receive a complimentary bottle of water. Other beverages and snacks are available for purchase once back at the reception area. After a few minutes of relaxation, you'll board your bus for the return to the pier.

Participants must be at least 5 years of age and weigh no more than 275 lbs. Although wildlife sightings are common, they are not guaranteed. This tour is not recommended for pregnant women or for guests with seizure disorders, heart, back, neck or balance problems. Please wear comfortable shoes and bring insect repellent. A change of clothing is recommended.

Aerial Tram & Rainforest Adventure **PASL30** **Approx. Duration: 7 hours**
Embark on an open-air gondola ride with a naturalist guide and safely glide through a living backdrop of giant trees, waterfalls and lush green landscapes. Panoramic ocean views and common sightings of wildlife that thrive in the canopy make this a truly unique transitional forest. This is also one of the few areas in Costa Rica where you can occasionally see spectacular toucans majestically soaring above the treetops or sitting in one of the trees. To complete your rainforest experience, visit the medicinal plant Garden and Heliconias Gallery. You'll also have a chance to pass through a snake exhibit set in the tropics and enjoy a delicious lunch before returning to your ship.

Note: Wear light clothes, closed-toe shoes. Bring rain gear and insect repellent. Bus ride is approximately 90 Minutes to the pier.

Aerial Tram & Zipline Adventure **PASL34** **Approx. Duration: 8 hours** **Level 2, A**
Experience the thrill of a zipline canopy tour without missing out on the rainforest's rich wildlife. This innovative "Tranopy" tour offers an in-depth forest view of an aerial tram with the excitement of a canopy tour. Your naturalist guide will accompany you to point out the secrets of the primary and secondary rainforest that surrounds you. Your Tranopy tour starts with a ride on the famous zipline. You'll experience all the different layers of the rainforest, from the floor up to the treetops. Silently glide through the colorful, colorful rainforest canopy. The 30 minute tram ride will bring you through the forest, over tumbling cascades and to the beginning of your adventure. You'll experience canyoning through ten cables – five of which are over 200 meters long. To your right, you'll see the rainforest, and to your left is an extensive view of the valley all the way to the Pacific Ocean. Over 1.5 kilometers of canopy views through everything from the rich rainforest ecosystems to sweeping views high above the forest floor.

Note: Participants must be at least 12 years of age and weigh no more than 260 lbs. Not recommended for pregnant women or those with back or neck injuries. Guest must fit into harness and helmet in a safe manner. Wear comfortable clothing and closed-toe shoes.

Tarcoles River Eco-Cruise Adventure **PASL18** **Approx. Duration: 4 ½ hours**
This adventure tour takes place in the Guacalillo Estuary on the Tarcoles River that forms the northern border of the Tarcoles National Reserve. It's home to one of the world's largest crocodile populations in the world with individuals up to 20 feet long that live in the estuary. In addition to the crocodiles, over 50 different bird species might be seen on site. This estuary is famous for its many species of birds, one of the nesting sites of the very rare scarlet macaw and a great variety of resident and migrant waterfowl, iguanas, lizards. Your adventure begins with a one hour ride on coastal and countryside roads, passing small towns en route to the Tarcoles Jungle Crocodile Safari created by the veterinarian Mr. Mario Orjuela in 1993. Using catamaran-style boats, you'll be able to view wild animals from a safe distance. A delicious tropical fruit buffet will be waiting for you at your return with tropical fruit. Ample time for purchasing crafts made by local artisans will be given.

Note: At the beginning of the Tarcoles exploration, you'll receive a free bird guide so that you can identify the birds that you see. Please wear comfortable shoes, long pants, a hat, sunscreen and bring sunglasses, a light jacket/raingear and insect repellent. Advance notice is needed for guest in wheelchairs. Motorized scooters cannot be handled on the gravel trails. Ample time for purchasing crafts made by local artisans will be given.

Tropical Forest Trekking & Waterfall Climbing **PASL41** **Approx. Duration: 6 hours** **Level 2, A**
Enjoy a completely amazing experience as you climb a tropical waterfall within a Costa Rican rain forest and then later take a bridge and ride a zip-line through the trees. From the pier, it's an approximately 75 minute drive to Rainforest Adventures, a 222 acre private reserve in the famous Jaco Beach area. You'll start your exhilarating adventure by defying your strength and climbing a face of a 160 ft. high waterfall. As you make your climb, the refreshingly pure water will be cascading over you, a sensation you won't soon forget. If your waterfall experience wasn't enough of an adrenaline rush, you'll next find yourself flying through the forest on a zip-line and then crossing a 130 ft. long hanging bridge that is suspended 82 ft. in the air. Back on solid ground, you'll trek back to the base camp where a traditional Costa Rican lunch awaits you in the Nature Café. Following lunch, you'll have free time to shop for handmade arts and crafts and souvenirs at the Congo shop before returning to the pier.

Note: Walking on this tour is moderate and includes some uneven and natural surfaces. There will be steps to negotiate. This tour is not recommended for wheelchair guests, anyone with mobility concerns, back or neck injuries or pregnant women. Participants must be in good physical condition. The tour is not considered suitable for those who suffer from a fear of heights. The minimum age to participate is 12 years old and the maximum allowable weight is 350 lbs. San Jose, National Theater, Sarchi & Lunch **PASL42** **Approx. Duration: 7 ½ hours**
Discover the wonders of San Jose on this full day adventure on this guided motorcoach tour in Costa Rica's vibrant capital. Visit the famed National Theater which was constructed in the late 19th century. The front of the theatre features statues of the composers Barock and Ludwig van Beethoven. There are several monuments by the entry walkway including Frédéric Chopin. The mural "Allegory of Coffee and Bananas" by Milanese artist Alesandro Villa, which is featured on the five colon bill. Venture to the town of Sarchi. This town offers more than 200 stores and small family-operated woodworking factories producing wooden furniture, tableware, and a wide variety of kitschy items. The most popular items on sale are "carretas", elaborately painted oxcarriage. Carry coffee from the highlands down to the port on the Pacific coast. Lunch at a local restaurant completes your exciting day.

Note: Wear light clothes and comfortable shoes.

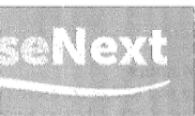
